KSU's History with Homelessness

- 1st KSU homeless student was identified in the 1980's
- 2006 KSU Student Health Services, in conjunction with Staff Senate, began Feed the Future
- October 13, 2008, KSU's Homelessness Awareness Week (HAW) began
- May 2013 KSU's Campus Awareness, Resource & Empowerment (CARE)
 Center opened

Case Management



For several years Case Managers have provided services to KSU students. The case manager is the person who aides in *putting all the pieces together.*

Case Management Team:

- Assess students' capacity to cope with their current situation/crisis
- Prioritize needs and develop a care/action plan
- Coordinate care with both formal and informal supports
- Refer students to on and off campus resources



The Owl's Closet



- A donation-based collection and referral service for food, clothing, toiletries and other necessities
- Toiletries, towels and washcloths, blankets, pillows, coats and hats are always available for urgent needs
- CARE operates the **Feed the Future Pantry** providing food as well as information on community pantries
- Clothing items collected by CARE are donated to local consignment shops and in turn the shops provide store credit for CARE students to obtain clothing and/or footwear



Funding Resources



Assists students with addressing their financial needs by:

- Assist in finding job opportunities both on and off campus
- Work with Financial Aid to determine if student is connected to all available resources
- Assisting students in applying for university and community-based grants and/or scholarships
- Locating benevolent organizations to offer services students may not be able to afford. (i.e. childcare, car maintenance, etc.)



Emergency Shelter



When students are in situations where they are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless, the CARE Center will

- Refer to local benevolent
 associations for Emergency
 Shelter (e.g. Must Ministries,
 area churches, YWCA, etc.)
 and
- Provide assistance with locating affordable living arrangements (i.e. extended stay hotels, area apartments, etc.).



Homelessness Awareness Week

Homelessness Awareness Week (HAW) provides an opportunity to learn more about this "invisible" population.



Activities, including an on-campus **Sleep-Out**, which can increase our knowledge and understanding of living without reliable shelter and food, and sometimes living without hope.

These scholarships are available to any KSU student in need and meets scholarship application requirements





STAR is a campus support program for students who have transitioned out of foster care services to independent living. Many of these students have no family connections which can result in a challenging transition and adjustment to college life.

State support is very limited and our students sometimes go without essential supplies during the course of the month, but are ashamed or afraid to ask for help.









Advisory Committee

Makes recommendations to the Director of Student Development and SSU by extension, on ways to enhance the university's ability to respond to the needs of students who are homeless, who have aged out of foster care and are having transitional problems, and those who are at risk of being homeless.
